### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today is the first day of Spring and as I write this almost a foot of snow has fallen. The earth is covered in a mantle of white; it sounds and looks more like Christmas than Spring. All the ugliness of daily life is covered over by this pristine blanket. We see the beauty around us. We are able to rejoice with the flocks of birds at the filled feeders and to delight in the magic glint of sun light on the snow. Everything looks clean and new.

All this reminds me of Easter and the new life granted by God in Christ. Our shortcomings, sins and distance from the Almighty is removed from our lives with the gift of forgiveness. We are made new. The blanket of God's forgiveness cleans us and leads us into service in God's hurting world. During Lent, we learned about ourselves and the things that got between us and God. We also explored the activity of God in our lives such as eradicating anger, being made by Christ, and living under a new covenant. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday drew us to God in a more strong and special way.

And then came Easter! The joy of Divine Love, freedom from sin, and the fulfilled promise of a future with God. It sets us on a path for presence in the world, service in Christ's name, and life lived as close to Christ-like as possible.

We are now in Eastertide moving toward Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit. Eastertide is a 50-day period, which begins on Easter Sunday evening, and ends on Pentecost Sunday the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2). The purpose is to celebrate the central mystery of Christ, his triumph over death and the cross, and the resurrection. Embrace God's love in your life! Blessings, Pastor Peggy








#### MAY CONCERT


